



## A Delegation from Turin University - Italy - at Okayama University

This visit is one of the multiple meetings/visits between Torino and Okayama Universities that were organised in the last 5 years (4 times Okayama Univ. delegations at Torino and a number of visits, meetings and seminars from Torino at Okayama University. At the last one - BE-ARCHAEO-kick-off on February 21st-2019, about 30 members of Torino University stayed at Okayama for about 2 weeks to 1 month)
